

## **Disability Policy**

Non-Destructive testing by its very nature requires manual dexterity and physical agility. There are some areas of industry where components can be tested in a workshop type environment but in other sectors components which need to be tested are part of much larger structures and need to be tested 'in situ'. Transport, power, nuclear, oil and gas, and aerospace components may well fall into this latter category. Prior to enrolment on a training course the employer and the potential trainee must carefully consider the physical aspects of the particular job and make a realistic assessment of whether that job could be done by that individual.

The facilities at this training school are situated at ground level and access is considered reasonable, with wheelchair ramps and wide doorways. Toilets are available at ground level.

Southern Technical Training Centre senior personnel are willing to discuss all aspects of the delivery of the training course and the physical requirements of the job. These discussions should involve the trainee, the employer and the trainer.
